"Fact or fiction, the ground truth behind Operation Urgent Fury, Grenada, 1983"

Please join us for our September 1st NWFMOA meeting. Our speaker is CMSgt Bill Walter. For more than two decades he served as an Aerial Gunner, accumulating over 3,100 flying hours while participating in a myriad of combat operations and special reconnaissance missions in El Salvador, Grenada, Panama, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Bosnia and Somalia. In 1980, Chief Walter trained and deployed in support of Operation EAGLE CLAW, in October 1983, he deployed in support of Operation URGENT FURY, where his gunship provided direct fire support for the Army on Fort Rupert and other tactical targets on the island. In 1989, Chief Walter was hand-selected to provide fire support to United States Army Rangers during the Rio Hato airfield seizure during Operation JUST CAUSE in Panama. His topic at our lunch will be "Fact or Fiction, the ground truth behind Operation Urgent Fury, Grenada, 1983". Chief Walter is a SOF Warrior, historian, and author.

Our **September 1st** lunch will start with a social gathering at 1130 with the meeting beginning at 1200 followed by lunch. # From the President's Pen By Mike Griffith

## What does September mean to you?

For many military veterans, this September marks the 21st anniversary of the Sep. 11, 2001 attack, in which terrorists hijacked four airliners, crashing two into the World Trade Center twin towers in New York City, one into the Pentagon in Washington D.C., and attempted to crash the fourth into either the White House or Capitol, but were thwarted by passengers who fought back, causing the plane to crash into a field in Pennsylvania.

The attack provoked the "War on Terror," to include the US invasions of Afghanistan and Iraq, passage of the Patriot Act, and other anti-terrorist actions in the US and elsewhere.

Today's high school and college students, as well as new military recruits, have no personal memory of the "Nine-Eleven" attack, although most clearly remember last August's sudden US withdrawal from Afghanistan and the subsequent Taliban takeover of that country.

Some other historical events during September include:

In Sep. 1774 the Continental Congress met for the first time, in Philadelphia PA. This was a key step toward American independence.

In Sep 1793, the French Revolution's "reign of terror" began with the beheading of French Queen Marie Antoinette. Thus began the executions of thousands of people suspected of opposing or not supporting the revolution. The terror was led by Committee of Public Safety leader Maximilian Robespierre, who was himself eventually introduced to Madame Guillotine.

In Sep. 1836 Sam Houston was elected as the first President of the new Republic of Texas. When Texas became a state, Houston became a US Senator, and later was Governor of Texas.

In Sep. 1882 the first Labor Day parade was held in New York City.

In Sept. 1906 football player Eddie Cochems of St. Louis University threw the first legal forward pass to teammate Jack Schneider, helping to secure a 22-0 win over Carroll College.

In Sep. 1969, US Army Lieutenant William Calley was charged with leading his men to kill over 300 civilians in the Vietnamese village of My Lai. The crime became a rallying symbol of the anti-war movement in the US, and to widespread stereotyping of American troops as "baby killers."

On Sep. 5, 1975, President Gerald Ford was nearly assassinated by Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme, but Secret Service agents tackled and disarmed her before she could shoot. President Ford was on his way to address the California Legislature on the subject of crime.

In Sep 1977, NASA launched the Voyager I spacecraft, which explored the solar system, passed the orbits of Neptune and Pluto, and is still sending back information from infinity and beyond. It also became the main character in the film, "Star Trek – the Motion Picture."

I found these items on the Internet, so they must all be true.

#### CALL THE MIDWIFE

Have you watched the PBS series "Call the Midwife"? It continues to be viewed in 200 countries! Mary and I have watched all 12 seasons. The success is rooted in the insightful writers, excellent actors, and thoughtful producers who capture so realistically the personalities and issues of our generation. We lived and relate through those decades; many of you were stationed in Europe during the 60's and 70's.

However, what grabs and holds our attention is the encounter of the helping professionals with the multitude of topics each character faces in the storyline- the challenges of unwed mothers, inter-racial marriages, dementia, birth defects, ill health, stillborn, poor working conditions, new births and deaths, faith, love, and romance to name a few. In the midst of all the suffering and joy is the gracious responses of the faithful nuns, dedicated midwives and steadfast nurses.

Many viewers underscore how they can relate to the characters and their stories. We faced these same topics. Individuals today can see the evolution of humanity's thinking and actions. Many are still dealing with abortion, adoption, drugs, employment, racism, single parents, etc.

Each show begins and ends with quotes from the true to life diary of the author. You cannot let go of the remote because over the shows history, our minds wait for and ease down as the closing narrator instills a mature philosophy for growth and moving on through our own lives. The shows are a cathartic mirror in which we see our reflection. We have lived these stories and know similar personalities; only the geography and actors have changed.

Let me share a few of our stimulating responses.

As spouses: we glean the importance of our amicable mutual respect.

As parents: the value of listening with kindness and not judging.

As a pastor: the amazement of God's involvement or non-involvement in congregant's lives.

As a paramedic: I remember my speechlessness at assisting delivery of a baby, while being there for our children's appearance into the world.

As a counselor: the importance of being considerate to each person's unique life journey.

As a chaplain: supporting the brave men and women we went to war with.

As a citizen: being cordial in all human encounters

Mary and I find these characters to be vibrant expressions of the Beatitudes manifested in humans. There is so much love, grace, mercy, forgiveness, courage, wisdom, humility, purity in their experiences. If only more humanity would learn and apply these lessons- what a better world we would live in.

At the end of the day, the nuns go to evening prayers and singing of the Psalms.

The midwives to their room for a beverage and conversation

In the morning, the whole team has a hot wash about the families they are serving courteously, professionally and with faith. I would recommend churches have a movie night and discuss these multi-layered stories.

Maybe you just might watch a live stream or get the DVD's from your library and let it speak to and mirror your unique life and social history. You will not be disappointed. Chaplain's honor.

Two Events Mark 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of United States Air Force; Membership and Community Outreach via FWB Chamber of Commerce; Emerald Coast Military Affairs Committee and FWB Chamber Military Affairs Committee Donate to Our MOAA Community Outreach Grant

Events Mark 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of USAF: The USAF was inaugurated as a separate military service on September 13, 1947. Two local events will celebrate this on Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> and on Wednesday, September 14<sup>th</sup>.

A <u>Community Celebration Honoring the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Air Force</u> will be held on Tuesday, Sept. 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at the Mattie Kelly Arts Center at Northwest Florida State College in Niceville from 1:30 – 3:30PM. This event is sponsored by the Eglin Federal Credit Union and Boeing, and hosted by the Greater Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce with music by Voices of NW Florida State College. The featured speaker will be **Captain** (**Retired**) **Dale Dye** who is a decorated Marine Veteran of the Vietnam War and the founder and head of Warriors, Inc., a technical advisory company specializing in portraying realistic military action in Hollywood films.

The theme of this event is "The Story behind the Story" as told by those who were there. In addition to Captain Dye, projected speakers are Cindy Chal (daughter of Doolittle Raider final survivor Col. Dick Cole) on the Doolittle Raider training on Eglin Field One; POW/Vietnam Col. Howard Hill, USAF, Ret.; Sontay Raid/Vietnam Veteran Col. Larry Ropka, USAF, Ret.; and, CMSgt Bill Walter, USAF, Ret., an AC-130 Gunship Aerial Gunner, speaking on Operation Eagle Claw (Iran Hostage Rescue Mission). Also, Lt. Col. Corby L. Martin, USAF, Ret., (USAFSOS), Primary Planner/Flight Lead speaking on Operation Desert Storm; Colonel Allison Black, USAF, Commander of the First Special Operations Wing, and an AC-130 Gunship Navigator speaking on Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan; discussion of the "MOAB" bomb development by Lt. Col. Mark Hunter, USAF, Ret., Program Engineer, Air Force Research Labs, and Lt. Gen. Brad Webb, USAF, Ret., speaking on the Bin Laden Raid.

The second event, "A Salute to Our Okaloosa Florida Veterans Hall of Fame Inductees", will be held on Wednesday, September 13, 2022 from 5:30 – 7:30PM at the Magnolia Grill, 157 Brooks Street, Fort Walton Beach. This event will honor members of Florida Veterans Hall of Fame from Okaloosa County. Two of the Hall of Fame members are members of our NWFMOA Chapter, i.e., Brig. Gen. T. Patt Maney, USAR, Ret., and Major Charles "Chuck" Merkel, USA, Ret. Both were inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2018. We're getting closer to the Fall season and, hopefully, the days will start getting cooler and less humid. A couple weeks ago I was looking back at the history of the NWFMOA Scholarship Fund and realized that this year is the **40**<sup>th</sup> **anniversary of NWFMOA awarding its first scholarship**. This scholarship was for \$500 and went to JROTC Cadet Blum at Crestview High School. Funds were raised via a golf tournament and cash donations by members.

In March of 1997, the Scholarship Fund was incorporated as the Northwest Florida Retired Officers Chapter (NWFROC) Scholarship Fund, Inc. in the State of Florida and registered with the IRS as a chapter 501C(3) non-profit organization which allowed donations to be deductible tax expenses. The initial Board of Directors were **Frank Glunn**, **John Birney**, **John Shortall**, **Jack Gardner**, **Marie Wagner**, **Lester Adams**, and **William Cullen**., all of whom are deceased. In May of 2003, with MOAA being renamed from TROA, the corporate name was changed to the NWFMOA Scholarship Fund, Inc. We are extremely grateful to our Chapter members who had the foresight to establish the Scholarship Fund as a non-profit organization.

Our scholarship program has grown quite a bit since then, and we anticipate having 10 to 11 scholarships available in March 2023 totaling approximately \$36,000. Our scholarships for 2023 will be available to JROTC cadets of seven local high schools and to Junior and senior ROTC cadets who are graduates of one of 13 local high schools. We will dedicate our scholarship raffles, silent and live auctions, and other donations at our Chapter Military Ball on Thursday, December 8, 2022 to remembering the 40-year history of our scholarship program.
